Last Week: God prospers us not for greed but for generosity.

This Week: God prospers us not for ourselves, but for Himself and others.

OUR GENEROSITY IMITATES JESUS' LOVE (v. 9)

⁹For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sake he became poor, so that you by his poverty might become rich.

- · Jesus is our Substitute
 - ·Jesus was "rich;" we were "poor"
 - ·Jesus became "poor;' we became "rich"

OUR GENEROSITY FULFILLS OUR LOVE (v. 10-11)

¹⁰And in this matter I give my judgment: this benefits you, who a year ago started not only to do this work but also to desire to do it. ¹¹So now finish doing it as well, so that your readiness in desiring it may be matched by your completing it out of what you have.

2 Corinthians 8:10-11
