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RIGHT WORSHIP

RIGHT WORSHIP IS SACRIFICIAL

⁶“A son honors his father, and a servant his master. If then I am a father, where is my honor? And if I am a master, where is my fear? says the LORD of hosts to you, O priests, who despise my name. But you say, ‘How have we despised your name?’
⁷By offering polluted food upon my altar. But you say, ‘How have we polluted you?’ By saying that the LORD’s table may be despised. ⁸When you offer blind animals in sacrifice, is that not evil? And when you offer those that are lame or sick, is that not evil? Present that to your governor; will he accept you or show you favor? says the LORD of hosts. ⁹And now entreat the favor of God, that he may be gracious to us. With such a gift from your hand, will he show favor to any of you? says the LORD of hosts.

Malachi 1:6-9

- v 6: If then I am a father, where is my honor? And if I am a master, where is my fear? says the LORD of hosts to you. But you say, ‘How have we despised your name?’
- v. 7: By offering polluted food upon my altar.

²¹But if it has any blemish, if it is lame or blind or has any serious blemish whatever, you shall not sacrifice it to the LORD your God.

Deuteronomy 15:21

- The priests’ arrogance in thinking they did nothing wrong.
 - v 6: How have we despised your name?
 - v 7: How have we polluted you?

¹⁰Oh that there were one among you who would shut the doors, that you might not kindle fire on my altar in vain! I have no pleasure in you, says the LORD of hosts, and I will not accept an offering from your hand. ¹¹For from the rising of the sun to its setting my name will be great among the nations, and in every place incense will be offered to my name, and a pure offering. For my name will be great among the nations, says the LORD of hosts. ¹²But you profane it when you say that the Lord’s table is polluted, and its fruit, that is, its food may be despised. ¹³But you say, ‘What a weariness this is,’ and you snort at it, says the LORD of hosts. You bring what has been taken by violence or is lame or sick, and this you bring as your offering! Shall I accept that from your hand? says the LORD. ¹⁴Cursed be the cheat who has a male in his flock, and vows it, and yet sacrifices to the Lord what is blemished. For I am a great King, says the LORD of hosts, and my name will be feared among the nations.

Malachi 1:10-14

- You can't love without being willing to sacrifice.

¹⁷I will surely bless you, and I will surely multiply your offspring as the stars of heaven and as the sand that is on the seashore. And your offspring shall possess the gate of his enemies, ¹⁸and in your offspring shall all the nations of the earth be blessed, because you have obeyed my voice."

Genesis 22:17-18

- God's more delight with our obedience than our sacrifices.

²²And Samuel said,

"Has the LORD as great delight in burnt offerings and sacrifices, as in obeying the voice of the LORD? Behold, to obey is better than sacrifice, and to listen than the fat of rams.

1 Samuel 15:22

- God teaches us what a real sacrifice is

- God's Response

¹⁶"For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life.

John 3:16

- Christ teaches us how to be a sacrifice

- Christ's Response

³⁹And going a little farther he fell on his face and prayed, saying, "My Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from me; nevertheless, not as I will, but as you will."

Matthew 26:39

RIGHT WORSHIP REQUIRES REPENTANCE

¹"And now, O priests, this command is for you. ²If you will not listen, if you will not take it to heart to give honor to my name, says the LORD of hosts, then I will send the curse upon you and I will curse your blessings. Indeed, I have already cursed them, because you do not lay it to heart. ³Behold, I will rebuke your offspring, and spread dung on your faces, the dung of your offerings, and you shall be taken away with it. ⁴So shall you know that I have sent this command to you, that my covenant with Levi may stand, says the LORD of hosts.

Malachi 2:1-4

- What does repentance look like? The same way you would apologize in a relationship.
 - Conversation—Prayer
 - Admittance—Confessing your sins
 - Apologizing—Asking for forgiveness
 - Believing forgiveness is granted—Reconciliation
 - Better choices—Changed behavior

RIGHT WORSHIP IS A LIFESTYLE

⁵My covenant with him was one of life and peace, and I gave them to him. It was a covenant of fear, and he feared me. He stood in awe of my name. ⁶True instruction was in his mouth, and no wrong was found on his lips. He walked with me in peace and uprightness, and he turned many from iniquity. ⁷For the lips of a priest should guard knowledge, and people should seek instruction from his mouth, for he is the messenger of the LORD of hosts. ⁸But you have turned aside from the way. You have caused many to stumble by your instruction. You have corrupted the covenant of Levi, says the LORD of hosts, ⁹and so I make you despised and abased before all the people, inasmuch as you do not keep my ways but show partiality in your instruction.”

Malachi 2:5-9

- Submission
 - v 5: Levi’s zeal and reverence for God caused him to be blessed and a covenant of life and peace. His uprightness led others to turn away from sin.
 - v. 7-9: God is reminding them of that as leaders their sin turned others to sin. There was no submission to God because there was no obedience. Just form and fashion.
 - Submission is a choice and a reflection of your heart.
