

## Who do you say He is? Mark 1:21-31

The word of the day: Authority

- Is authority a naughty word?
- It's not authority we have a problem with, it's the person in authority that is the problem.
- We can trust God's GOOD authority because of what we see in Mark 1:21-31.
  - Jesus is the authority on truth.
  - Jesus is the authority in the spiritual realm.
  - Jesus has authority over the physical world.

## 1. Jesus is the authority on truth

- Mark 1:21 And they went into Capernaum, and immediately on the Sabbath he entered the synagogue and was teaching. 22 And they were astonished at his teaching, for he taught them as one who had authority, and not as the scribes.
- The people of the synagogue recognized the authority of Jesus, but they did not accept His authority in their lives.
  - "Jesus receives his authority directly from the Father. The teachers of the law derive their authority from Torah, but Jesus appeals to a superior authority resident in himself" (David Garland, *A Theology of Mark's Gospel*, 270).

- God is the author of truth so we should trust His Word.
- · Following Jesus means accepting His Truth.

## 2. Jesus is the authority in the spiritual realm

- Mark 1:23 And immediately there was in their synagogue a man with an unclean spirit. And he cried out, 24 "What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are—the Holy One of God." 25 But Jesus rebuked him, saying, "Be silent, and come out of him!" 26 And the unclean spirit, convulsing him and crying out with a loud voice, came out of him. 27 And they were all amazed, so that they questioned among themselves, saying, "What is this? A new teaching with authority! He commands even the unclean spirits, and they obey him." 28 And at once his fame spread everywhere throughout all the surrounding region of Galilee.
- The demons knew the authority of Jesus, but they did not submit to His authority.
  - "For Mark, the demonic realm represents a real power that invades the human realm. It seeks to take human minds and lives captive and to destroy them" (David Garland, *A Theology of Mark's Gospel*, 266).
- When Jesus is in your life, you can trust that He will fight for you, and He always wins!
- 3. Jesus has authority over the physical world
- Mark 1:29 And immediately he left the synagogue and entered the house of Simon and Andrew, with James and John. 30 Now Simon's mother-in-law lay ill with a fever, and immediately they told him about her. 31 And he came and took her by the hand and lifted her up, and the fever left her, and she began to serve them.
- Peter's mother-in-law experienced the power of Jesus and she responded by serving Him
- The immediate and full recovery of Simon's mother-in-law with no aftereffects is confirmed when she takes over her duties as hostess and "waits on them" (1:31; lit., "she was serving them"). She serves Jesus as the angels served him in recognition of his authority (1:13). David Garland, *A Theology of Mark's Gospel*, 108
- When Jesus works in your life, you should respond with thanksgiving and service.

Will you recognize and submit to the authority of Jesus?

- You need to come to a place where you realize Jesus is God and that He is sovereign
  - "Whereas omnipotence tells us how much and which powers God has Sovereignty clarifies the extent to which God uses those powers" (John Frame, *No One Like Him*).

- Seeing who Jesus is and knowing who Jesus is should lead you to surrender to who He is and experience His power in your life.
  When you welcome Jesus into your life, you must accept His GOOD Authority over
- all aspects of your life
